Dear Resident:

Good news! Allied Waste, Inc. (formerly B.F.I.), will be donating mulch to the Village of Glenwillow which the Village will then distribute to the residents. Upon request, our Service Department will deliver one load (approximately 2 cubic yards) to your driveway area only. We will be receiving a limited supply of mulch and it will be on a first-come first-serve basis. Please call Village Hall at 440-232-8788 from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM no later than May 9th to request your load of mulch. We greatly appreciate this donation from Allied Waste, Inc.

Also, the Village of Glenwillow will be offering free curbside tree chipping and collection to Glenwillow residents on Monday, May 19th. Please have your tree trimmings set out no later than 8:00 AM on Monday morning. If the collection is not completed on Monday, pick up will resume on Tuesday, May 20th. Signs will be posted to remind you of the date the chipping will be done.

As part of the Village of Glenwillow's geese management efforts, residents and business owners may periodically experience a loud noise (like a firecracker or a screeching sound) during daylight hours. The noise deterrents do not harm geese and are designed to scare and keep geese from fouling public areas. In April and May, the Canada geese seek nesting sites and become very territorial so it is important during April and May to use such noise deterrents in the immediate vicinity of Lake Avery and the Village Park to keep the geese from nesting there.

You may be eligible for a Homestead Exemption on your real estate taxes. The state has expanded the Homestead reduction benefit to include any homeowners (regardless of income), age 65 or older, permanently and totally disabled, or the surviving spouse of a person who was receiving the previous Homestead Exemption at the time of death (where the surviving spouse was at least 59 years old on the date of death). All eligible homeowners will receive a flat reduction of \$25,000. off of the market value of the taxpayers' property.

REPORT FROM THE MAYOR

PETTIBONE ROAD MULTIPURPOSE TRAIL

Construction of the project is to restart on Tuesday, April 29, 2008. A set completion date has not yet been set, but there will be at least several more months of construction. Roadway traffic is to be maintained throughout the remaining time of the construction; however, there may be slight delays due to construction operations.

AUSTIN POWDER BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

The Austin Powder bridge replacement over the Beaver Meadow Creek construction will begin in July of this year. The new bridge will look the same as the Pettibone Road Bridge over Tinkers Creek with the beautiful simulated stone parapets, railings and lights.

This construction will require Austin Powder Road to be closed completely for approximately three (3) months. You will be notified as to the specific times and dates as soon as they are available to us.

TREE REMOVAL

Please do not attempt to remove any trees near or within public right of way without first determining if trees are located on resident's property or in the Village right-of-way. Usually, the resident's front property line begins approximately 30 feet from the centerline of the existing pavement.

If any questions, please call Village Hall at 440-232-8788 and talk to Milt Gozelanczyk—Project Manager, to make certain of tree locations prior to cutting of any trees in question.

DIAMOND CENTER SUBDIVISION

Geis Companies will begin construction of the widening of the Pettibone Road pavement in conjunction with their Diamond Center Industrial Park. The new widened pavement will be a reinforced concrete with concrete curbs, gutters, and storm drainage system. The length of the widened pavement will be approximately 1,335 linear feet from the Cochran Road intersection easterly to approximately the second curve of the "S" curve.

Also, Geis Companies will soon began construction of the bike path along Pettibone Road. The bike path will be a 10 feet wide asphaltic path located on the South side of Pettibone Road approximately 12 to 15 feet off of the edge of the existing asphalt roadway constructed from Diamond Parkway to the Solon city line.

The construction of the bike path will require extensive clearing and grading of the steep slope on the South side of the roadway. This work will have to be done very close to the roadway. For the safety of the traveling public, Pettibone Road will therefore be closed from Cochran Road to the first residential property in Solon, for approximately three (3) weeks.

Residents will be notified further regarding the closing and detours of Pettibone Road when exact dates are available.

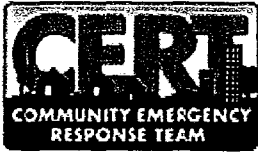

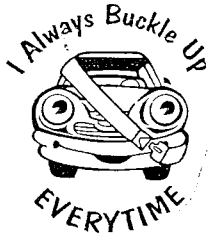

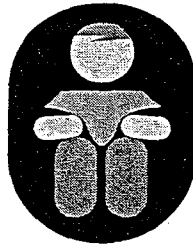

SAFETY TOPICS

Seat belts are the most effective means of reducing fatal and nonfatal injuries in motor vehicle crashes. Approximately 7,000 people die each year in survivable crashes on U.S. roads because they weren't wearing seatbelts. Insist that those who travel with you buckle up. It's the easiest thing you can do to protect yourself, your friends and your family.

















































SPEED- exceeding the posted speed limit or driving too fast for conditions is one of the most prevalent factors contributing to traffic crashes. Speeding reduces a driver's ability to steer safely around curves or objects in the roadway and increases the distance a vehicle travels while the driver reacts to a dangerous situation. Excessive speed cause almost 50% of fatal crashes in Ohio.




