

ORDINANCES PASSED IN APRIL, MAY & JUNE 2009

- 2009-4-27 An emergency ordinance canceling the July 15 and August 19, 2009 work session meetings of Council as a summer recess.
- 2009-5-29 An emergency ordinance amending the Glenwillow building code by adding Section 1301.11 (e) allowing an optional method for posting residential building permit deposits and allowing the use of surety bonds in certain instances.
- 2009-5-31 An emergency ordinance authorizing and approving transfers and advances between funds.
- 2009-6-33 An emergency ordinance amending Section 1301.11 (e) of the Glenwillow building code which places certain limitations on the use of surety bonds to be used for residential building permit deposits.

LIST OF SERVICES PROVIDED FOR THE RESIDENTS OF GLENWILLOW

1. SNOW REMOVAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

This free assistance is provided to those residents who meet certain requirements:

If you are age 65 or older

- Own and reside on property
- No other able-bodied person who resides with you is capable of removing snow

If you are under 65:

- Own and reside on property in an effort to reduce emergency medical help
- Physically disabled (need physician certificate)
- No other able-bodied person who resides with you is capable of removing snow

2. USE OF VILLAGE TRUCK

The Village truck is available to the residents of Glenwillow from April 1st until October 31st each year. The use of the truck is limited to the collection of trash only. Items that cannot be loaded on the truck are: grass clippings, tree trunks/roots, bags of leaves, aerosol cans, paint and paint cans. This truck is also Not allowed for construction debris which is the responsibility of a contractor.

To request use of the truck, please call the Street Commissioner and inform him of the location you want the truck parked on your property. When you have completed your project, call the Village Hall for truck pick-up.

3. TIRE ROUND-UP

The Street Commissioner conducts the county's annual scrap tire roundup each September. Passenger car tires without rims will be collected. The Village drop-off location is next to the service garage located at Pettibone and Austin Powder Drive. The Tire Round-Up is scheduled in September.

4. KIDS ANNUAL SAFETY FAIR

The Glenwillow Police Department sponsors this safety fair at the Village Hall for children age 6 and above. Included in the fair are safety talks, games, prizes, raffles, crafts, and lunch.

5. PHONE BOOK ROUND-UP

During the month of July, two containers are placed next to the Service Garage for disposal of your phone books.

6. WASTE AND RECYCLABLE PICKUP

Glenwillow provides weekly pick up of solid waste and recyclables placed at the "curbside" by residents. This residential pickup is provided at no cost to the residents and no cost to the taxpayers.

7. **VILLAGE MAILBOX**

The United States Postal Service maintains a mailbox at the Village Hall. In order to keep the box on our property, we must have at least 25 pieces of mail daily for the 12:00 noon pick-up.

8. **HELMET SMART PROGRAM**

The Glenwillow Police Department participates in the Helmet Smart Program sponsored by AAA Ohio Motorists Association. Children riding bikes while wearing helmets will be given a safety citation for a food item or other discounts by our Officers.

9. **GLENWILLOW RESIDENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

Every year, a one-time monetary scholarship gift is awarded to each graduate of Solon High School who is a resident of Glenwillow. The student must meet certain criteria to be eligible.

10. **POLICE SECURITY CHECK FOR VACATIONERS**

If you are planning a vacation or will be gone from your residence for a while, the Glenwillow Police will check on your home in your absence. For this service, please come to the Police Department and fill out a security form.

11. **CHILD SEAT SAFETY INSPECTION**

The Glenwillow Police Department may be contacted for a free inspection of your child's safety seat.

12. **SHOP WITH A COP PROGRAM**

Glenwillow Police Department participates in the "Shop with a Cop" program sponsored by the Fraternal Order of Police. Some of the children from the Glenwillow area are taken on a shopping spree at a department store. A ride in police cars, snacks, and lunches are provided.

13. **COMMUNITY POLICING**

Our full time officers, in addition to their civic duties, provide free services such as bicycle helmet program, child safety seat installation and inspection, and a senior citizen welfare check program.

14. **NOTARY PUBLIC**

Free notary service is available to all residents of Glenwillow. This service is available Monday through Thursday, 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM daily.

15. **INFORMATIONAL BOOKLETS**

The Village Hall has free booklets on fishing, hunting, and trapping regulations and State of Ohio maps, Cuyahoga County Maps, etc.

16. REGISTRATION TO VOTE

A poll booth is located at the Village Hall. All residents who want to register can fill out the proper forms.

17. ANIMAL WARDEN

Upon request of the Village residents, our Animal Warden provides the services of trapping dangerous and sick wild animals that possess a threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the residents. If there are any animals running at large, please call the Village Hall.

18. HUNTING

Attached is the ordinance for bow hunting for deer within the Village of Glenwillow.

19. FREE MULCH

Every resident, if they want, is delivered 2 yards of free mulch. Allied Waste supplies the mulch.

20. LIFELINE PROGRAM

“Lifeline” is a program, places an electronic alert with the elderly or infirm residents. In the event the resident needs aid, a button is pushed and a 24-hour communication center dispatches a friend or relative to check out the situation.

21. CONCERTS IN THE PARK

The concerts in the park are held from May until September at the gazebo located on Towne Center Drive, next to our beautiful Avery Lake and behind Village Hall. We offer a wide variety of musical styles, with emphasis placed on quality and entertainment. There is no charge for these concerts and we invite you and your family to bring a blanket or a lawn chair and enjoy the evening. Refreshments and chips are available at no cost.

22. SENIOR CITIZEN CHECK BY POLICE DEPARTMENT

In an effort to reduce emergency medical help, the Glenwillow Police Department does a check on the welfare of the senior citizens

23. VACCINE PROGRAM

Flu shots are being made available at the Village Hall annually in October. The Cuyahoga County Board of Health, in cooperation with the Mayor’s office, is sponsoring the vaccine program. It is open to the public as well as residents. If you are not on Medicare, the cost is \$25.

24. SENIOR CITIZEN VAN

Glenwillow was able to enter into a consortium with the City of Solon, Bentleyville and Chagrin Falls for two Senior Citizen vans. Grants paid for these vans. To reserve a seat and cost, please call 440-349-6363. Allow a week’s notice to reserve your seat.
