The Mayor, Mark A Cegelka called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and all present said the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the Regular Council meeting of Sept. 4, 2019 were approved as presented. (Adie/DeCarlo). Mrs. DiBacco abstained.

CORRESPONDENCE & MAYOR'S REPORT:

PRESENTATION, ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Mayor Cegelka stated that at the next council meeting on Oct. 2, he plans to have legislation authorizing a contract with the Midwest Railroad as a donation to pay for the moving of the train depot to the park. He also stated that he has been working with the officials from NOCO on a potential incentive package to keep them in the Village.

The Mayor also told Council that he met with the Village of Walton Hills about the protocol for the tornado siren. He said that they have agreed the dispatcher on duty can now set off the siren when authorized. He said the siren controls will likely be moved to the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Center next year.

Mr. Marong stated that he inquired today about the status of the vacant lot on Pinecrest and nothing has been approved yet. It usually takes about 30 days and if the pending sale

falls through, the property will go to the Village. He added he should have more information at the next council meeting.

Mayor Cegelka proposed moving the Organizational meeting of 2020 to Thursday, Jan 2 at 7:00 pm, since Jan 1st is a Wednesday.

Motion by Larry Sylver second by Jeff Adie to move the January 1, 2020 Organizational Meeting of Council to January 2, 2020.

Mr. Marong reminded council since it will be the beginning of a new term, elections for Vice Mayor and other officers will need to take place at the meeting. Mayor Cegelka stated he will ask Judge Brian Melling to swear the council members into office for the new term.

Mr. Henry told council that Austin Powder Drive will be closed southbound (tentatively) starting Monday, Sept. 23, so they can complete the concrete work. He stated the road will be north bound only. He added that when the west side of the road is completed and they move to the east side, the traffic will still be routed the same way until the concrete work is completed.

Mr. Henry also wanted to inform Council that the sewer cleaning trucks will be in the Village doing cleaning of both sanitary and storm sewers on Tinker's Valley, Tinker's Court and South and North Village Lanes. He added, work should start in a couple of weeks.

Mr. Henry announced that the repair work on Tinker's Creek Trail - South has been completed and the trail is now open.

COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Mr. Banas announced that the Infrastructure Committee will meet on Sept. 25th at 5:30 pm to discuss the Railroad Depot and the sewers on Pettibone Road.

Mr. Slyver announced that the Recreation Committee will meet on Wednesday, Oct. 2nd at 6:15 pm.
