FINANCE DIRECTOR JOHN VERES:

The Village received 3 proposals from different contractors for the improvements to the community garden area. Gradeline was the best proposal and the lease amount for cost.

CHIEF GREG CURTIN:

Chief Greg Curtin commented; extra signage was put up due to the Cochran Road improvements to close Austin Powder until the project is complete.

Chief Curtin would like to make some changes to the community policing; adding a golf cart to the police fleet will make it more inviting to the residents and there will be more involvement with the senior citizens.

SERVICE DIRECTOR SAM SCAFFIDE:

Service Director Sam Scaffide reported; the flowers are being hung and planted throughout the Village. The next curbside branch chipping will take place on June 20th. Approximately 110 trees have been planted on Diamond Parkway this week thanks to the Tree Canopy Grant the Village received. Street sweeping and striping have been completed. Sam and Chief Curtin met with Gillmore Security about installing cameras throughout the Village for added security to the parks and some intersections.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR JEREMY ROWAN:

Economic Development Director Jeremy Rowan reported; the annual TIRC meeting is scheduled for June 9th and will be a ZOOM meeting. All companies have exceeded their payroll expectations this year.
