FINANCE DIRECTOR JOHN VERES:

Finance Director John Veres commented; The Tax Budget for 2026 is on the agenda for passage this evening. This sets the Village's millage for next year. The millage of 3.3 has not changed.

LAW DIRECTOR MARK MARONG:

Law Director Mark Marong commented on the following agenda items:

Items 2 & 3 will be placed on second reading. There was language changed in Senate Bill 104 that allows communities to regulate or prohibit short term rentals. These were referred to Planning Commission for review and will come back to Council in August.

The rest of the items on the agenda are Engineering items.

A motion will need to be made to enter into Executive Session to consider confidential business information of an applicant for economic development assistance and to consider the employment and appointment of a public employee.

ENGINEER/SERVICE DIRECTOR MIKE HENRY:

Mike Henry commented; his reports were submitted into the Mayor's report and the following items on the agenda are Engineering items:

On the agenda is the authorization to apply for CDBG funds to replace the gazebo at Avery Lake and OPWC funds for sewer maintenance.

There is a donation agreement with Brooklyn Heights for them to take the playground at the DNP park and accepting the bid of Irvin's Inc to do the work of the improvements of the new playground.

The acceptance of the proposal for street striping from American Roadway Logistics is on for passage.

There is a change order with Barbicas Paving for the Asphalt Program. This is a deduct.

Authorization is needed to advertise for bids for the Pettibone Rd. Storm Sewer Project Phase I.

The Richmond Road project with the Cleveland Metroparks project has begun.

CHIEF CURTIN:

Chief Curtin submitted his reports into the Mayor's reports.

The new vehicle is completed and in service. The vehicle will be used by the supervisors. The vehicle it is replacing will be placed for sale on GovDeals.

The Chief thanked the Service Department for getting the back door of the PD replaced. For security reasons, the new door does not have a window.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR JEREMY ROWAN:

Economic Development Director Jeremy Rowan reported; the TIRC reports are due by July 7th. Jeremy and John are working on submitting all requested documentation. Once all reports are submitted, the County will schedule the TIRC meeting.

The E-News will be sent to all businesses tomorrow.

InterDesign has consolidated from multiple locations to its building on Emerald Valley Parkway. The company recently listed its building for sale or lease with a local commercial real estate firm. In discussions with the real estate agent and a company representative, InterDesign would like to remain in a portion of the building but is open to all options. If the company relocates from the Village there will be implications for the CRA that is active on a portion of the building.

Eight transportation companies are operating in Glenwillow Amazon facility and withholding employee payroll tax to the Village. Through the first two quarters of 2025, the Village has collected \$463,000 in

payroll withholdings from all the companies operating out of the Victory Parkway facility, including Amazon.

The new owners of the Stratford Commons building are in the process of closing the deal. They will be opening an assisted living facility with memory care.

Mayor Cegelka commented; there is a Planning Commission Meeting scheduled for July 16, 2025 at 5:30PM. The agenda contains discussion on amending short-term rentals in the Village. The Architectural Review Board meeting has been canceled due to lack of agenda.

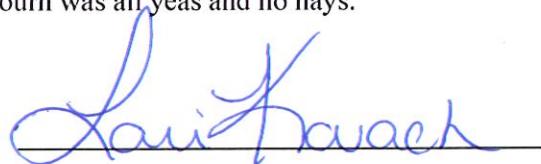
