PAVILION RENTALS

COCHRAN & PETTIBONE ROAD INTERSECTION



The intersection at Cochran and Pettibone Roads will undergo a major improvement in 2018. The intersection will be widened to better accommodate truck traffic and new concrete will be laid. This work is scheduled to start in late spring. Due to the impact of winter weather, this intersection has deteriorated which resulted in many chuckholes. The Service Department monitors this area daily and makes temporary improvements as needed. We ask for your patience during construction.

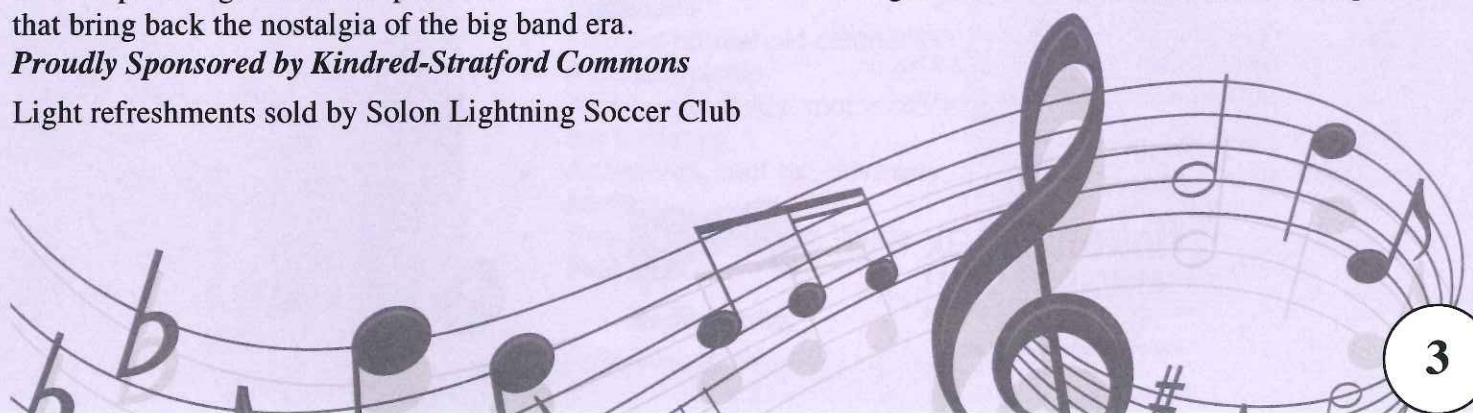

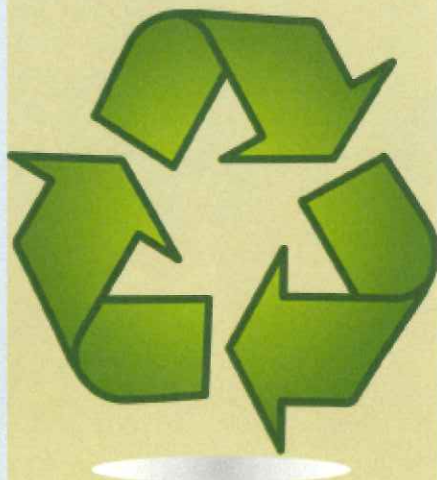

Household materials accepted

- Oil or solvent-based paint, sealers, primers, or coatings (aerosols or liquids)
- Varnishes, polyurethanes, shellacs
- Paint thinner, mineral spirits, turpentine
- Pesticides, herbicides, fungicides
- Caustic household cleaners
- Pool chemicals
- Automotive fluids, motor oil, car batteries
- Adhesives, roof tar, driveway sealer
- Kerosene, gasoline, lighter fluid

Materials NOT accepted at this collection

- Latex paint
- Explosives, gun powder, ammunition, flares
- Medical waste, pharmaceuticals, medicine, sharps
- Radioactive waste (i.e. smoke detectors)

- Business or commercial waste

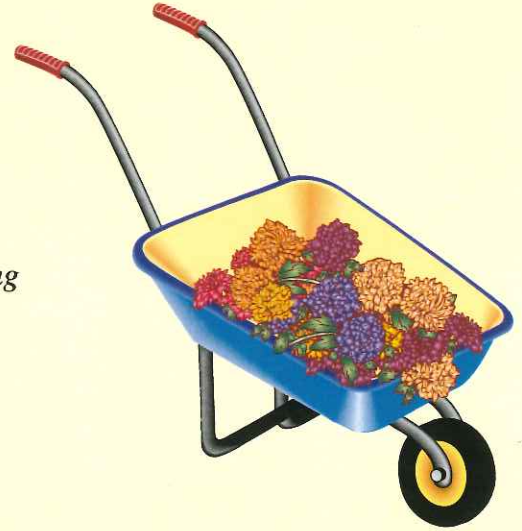

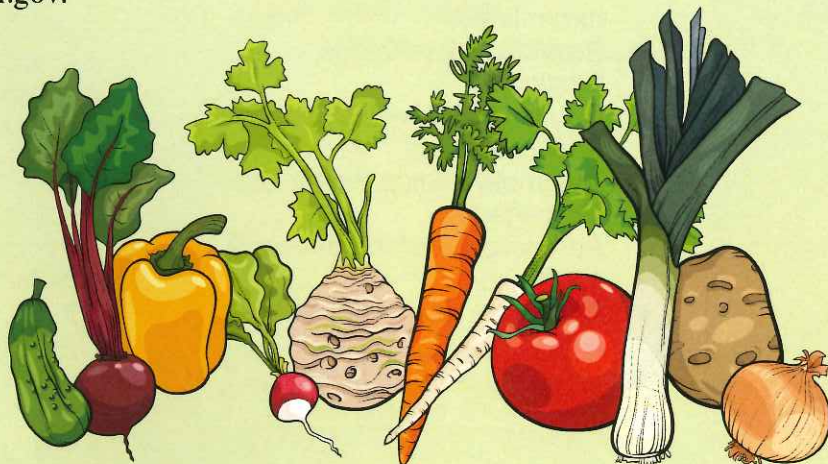
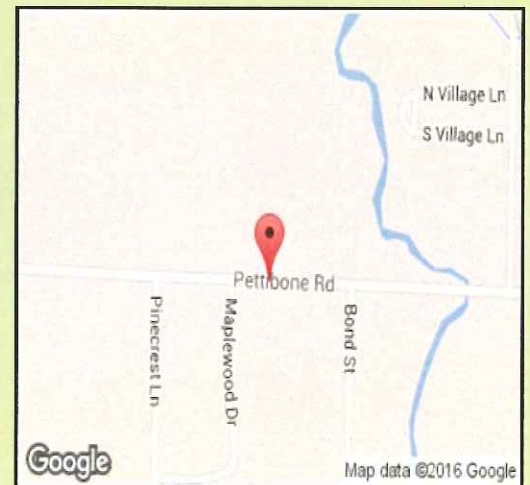


VILLAGE OF GLENWILLOW COMMUNITY GARDENS

Please have your tree trimmings set out no later than 8:00AM on the scheduled Monday mornings.

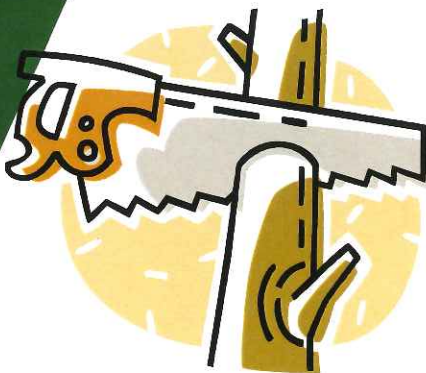
PLEASE NOTE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CHIPPER:

No Stumps – No Roots – No Foreign Matter
Nothing larger than 7 inches in diameter
Cut “Y” Shaped Branches in Two
No Firewood – No logs less than 4 feet long
Separate small from large branches
Face “Cut End” of branches towards the road

TIPS FOR MANAGING THROUGH A POWER OUTAGE

SAFETY INFORMATION

- Stay away from downed power lines and anything touching them.
- If you see a wire down, call us at **1-888-LIGHTSS (544-4877)** or local police or fire. Don't report a line down unless you see one down. It will slow down the restoration if we have to respond to false reports.
- Never use your stove, gas grill or a heater designed for outdoor use to heat your home.
- Never use candles around pets or small children.
- Visit our website at: www.firstenergycorp.com for outage maps and other useful information.

REPORTING AN OUTAGE

If your power is out, please report it to us. This can help us pinpoint damage and restore power more quickly. You can report your outage several ways:

- Call us at **888-LIGHTSS (888-544-4877)** Please check your account to make sure your cell phone is registered with us before you need to report an outage.
- Use the outage reporting function on our mobileoptimized website, www.firstenergycorp.com, or on our free smartphone app.
- Text **OUT** to **544487** to report your outage via text messaging. You can also sign up on our website for outage email or text alerts.
- More information about our outage reporting and technology tools can be found on our website, www.firstenergycorp.com/connect.

RESTORING YOUR SERVICE

- We secure any known hazards first (downed wires, for example) – usually by sending out Hazard Responders to keep the area clear. They are not trained to make repairs. They are there to help keep the public safe until repairs can be made.
- We give priority to hospitals, police and fire departments and other critical facilities.
- We repair transmission lines and substations that supply power to the local system first.
- Then we make repairs that restore the largest number of customers – this is the fastest way to restore all customers.
- We understand that customers with well water face additional challenges when the power is out – many of us have wells, too. The best way to address this is to stock up on drinking water and fill bathtubs with water in advance of the storm. Also, listen to the local media for information on shelters and free ice and water distribution.

1. Remove the smoke alarm from the wall or ceiling.
2. Look at the back of the alarm for the date of manufacture.
3. Smoke alarms should be replaced 10 years from the date of manufacture.
4. Put the alarm back on the ceiling or wall if it is less than 10 years old.

LIFELINE SYSTEMS

The Village has a contract with Lifeline Systems for 15 monthly services for our senior citizen residents. This service allows for residents to call for assistance with the push of a button worn around your neck or as a bracelet. If you or a neighbor can benefit from this service, please call Lori at Village Hall at 440-232-8788.

DISPOSE OF UNNEEDED MEDICATIONS

In addition to keeping these substances out of our water supply, safe disposal of unneeded medication helps to keep drugs out of the hands of people who might abuse them.

The Village now has a secure permanent drop box where prescriptions and over-the-counter medications can be placed for safe disposal. Pills and patches only, no liquids or needles are to be dropped off for destruction. The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's office will make scheduled routine pick ups.

The box is located inside the lobby at Village Hall 29555 Pettibone Road Village Hall is open Monday –Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

LICENSE PLATE & DRIVERS LICENSE RENEWAL

When you renew your license plates or drivers license with the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicle, please remember to make sure you tell the clerk, or you indicate online, that you live in GLENWILLOW. The Village receives its portion of the license tax fee which is used to repair our roads. Since Glenwillow shares a zip code with Solon, many times the plates are registered incorrectly. There is no difference in the tax if you are listed with Solon or Glenwillow. Please help us earn the money for which we are entitled.

CUSTOMER ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS FOR YOUR ELECTRIC BILL

There are many programs available to Ohio customers who are having difficulty paying their electric utility bills. Please review to see if they may help you or someone you know.

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)

This program is administered by the Ohio Development Services Agency's Office of Community Assistance. It is designed to help eligible low-income Ohioans meet the high costs of home heating. Customers must be at or below 175% of federal poverty guidelines.

HEAP Crisis Programs

Summer Crisis – The Summer Crisis Program provides summer cooling assistance for low-income, elderly households and for Ohioans with qualifying medical conditions. Customers must be at or below 175% of federal poverty guidelines, have a member of the household who is at least 60 years old or has an illness that would benefit from assistance, verified by physician documentation. The program is available from July 1 through Aug. 31.
