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**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

The minutes of the Regular Council Meeting of March 1, 2017 were approved as presented.

Jeff Adie reported he attended the Solon Board of Education and Council Meeting. They discussed two Resolutions on their agenda; opposing the changes of the CAT Tax (personal tangible reimbursement to the schools). Jeff suggested the Village have legislation drawn up to oppose this too. The other item was the Net Profit Tax. Mayor Cegelka explained the State Legislature promised that cities and schools would be made whole on the CAT Tax reimbursements and then took it away. Ultimately, schools will have to come back with a levy because of the loss of potential revenue. This will impact the residents and businesses.

Don Banas questioned the centralization of tax collection in Columbus and wondered what the benefit is. The money is collected and then rerouted. The State is tampering with a system that did not need fixed.

Jeff Adie stated; Senator Matt Dolan was in attendance at the meeting in Solon and expressed he was opposed also.

Gurvis Smith reported; at the meeting discussion took place regarding the tornado sirens. It was stated; the sirens are not supposed to be heard inside homes. Mayor Cegelka stated; maps of where the sirens are located will be given once he receives them. The sirens will be tested on March 22<sup>nd</sup>.




